This year the Zionist Organization of America is marking the 120th anniversary of its origination. Since its founding in 1897, ZOA has been fighting for the Jewish people and the Land of Israel.

Under the leadership of such illustrious presidents as Supreme Court Justice Louis Brandeis and current National President Morton A. Klein, ZOA works to strengthen U.S.-Israel relations through educational activities; public affairs programs; lobbying on Capitol Hill; outreach to the under-informed; and combating anti-Israel bias in the media, textbooks, and on college campuses. ZOA has more than 25,000 members, with chapters in Philadelphia, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, Detroit, Long Island, Miami, Milwaukee, North Jersey, Oakland, Pittsburgh and Washington, D.C.

- ZOA was victorious in its campaign to get the Department of Education's Office of Civil Rights to use Title VI to protect Jewish students on campus who face hostile conditions due to anti-Semitic harassment, intimidation and discrimination. ZOA's Center for Law & Justice has filed complaints on behalf of Jewish students citing Title VI at Rutgers University, UC Irvine, UC Santa Cruz, and Columbia University.
- ZOA is the only organization that documents and exposes Palestinian-Arab violations of the Oslo Accords and the "Road Map." ZOA's efforts for American victims of Palestinian-Arab terrorism led to the passing of the Koby Mandell Act.
- The ZOA has played a key role in Congress regarding victims of terrorism, keeping Jerusalem unified under Israeli sovereignty, fighting Hamas and Fatah, and working on the imposition of sanctions on Syria and Saudi Arabia.
- ZOA's campaigns have succeeded in defeating hostile critics of Israel nominated for government positions.
- ZOA's Government Relations Department continues to educate lawmakers and discuss key legislation.
- The ZOA's growing Campus Activism Network regularly brings student activists to Israel for leadership training programs and is active on college campuses throughout the country. Our Young Professionals Division was created with the vision of gathering leaders, visionaries, advocates and supporters to Israel and combining their efforts with those of ZOA for the benefit of Israel.

The ZOA Amud Ha' Kehillah Award (Pillar of the Community Award)

Most communities are like a house. A very large house.

Like a house, they have a foundation and many distinct areas, each serving its own purpose. There is an area in public view, and a space that is often unseen by all but a select few.

If the particular community is truly fortunate, it includes pillars to prop it up and lessen the burden on the foundation.

Klal Yisrael has had literal pillars (known as *amudim*) since the time of the Tabernacle, and figurative pillars even earlier, dating back to the Patriarchs and Matriarchs.

Today, the Greater Philadelphia-area Jewish community is blessed to have among us many people who can be described as "pillars" who are out in front, always reliable to be supportive and serve as role models.

They offer their leadership or their time, their expertise and encouragement, their dollars *and* their sense.

Typically they are selfless and act out of love for their people and for a near and dear cause. Their devotion and enthusiasm are often contagious — inspiring friends, relatives, and even strangers to try to match their passion, dedication, energy and level of participation in the community.

Even though they may have a title or prominent position, often they go about their work unnoticed. But surely, without such individuals, couples, and families, it is quite likely that the community might weaken and sag.

These "pillars" serve our community and the Zionist Organization of America in a variety of ways including by allotting time, energy and creativity to the cause of Israel, ZOA and the community at large. It is only fitting that from time to time, ZOA and the community give back by recognizing their good and important deeds and the vital roles they play.

Amud Ha'Kehillah Award Recipient (Pillar of the Community) Allen L. Rothenberg

Allen L. Rothenberg, Esq., is a household name in Philadelphia. He is the founder of one of the nation's leading multi-state personal injury law firms and is listed as a "Top 100" trial lawyer by the National Trial Lawyers Association.

What may be less known but is every bit as important is that Allen Rothenberg has promulgated legislation and achieved recordbreaking awards on behalf of victims of state sponsored terrorism. He is also a generous philanthropist.

For 35 years, Rothenberg has served as the president of the National Jewish Commission on Law and Public Affairs (COLPA). Rothenberg also has been, for many years, a staunch supporter of Jewish day school education in Philadelphia. He has had a daily *Mincha Minyan* and Torah study group in his Center City Philadelphia office continually for two decades.

Allen L. Rothenberg founded The Rothenberg Law Firm LLP in 1969. He has been involved in multiple high-profile cases before state, federal, and appellate courts, including the Supreme Court of the United States.

In addition, he has served as a guest lecturer at law schools, graduate schools, colleges, and secondary schools, including the Temple University School of Law, The University of Pennsylvania, and Villanova Law School. He earned B.S. and J.D. degrees from Temple University. He is admitted to the bars of Pennsylvania, New York and the District of Columbia as well as the United States Supreme Court.

Also, he has made guest appearances on national and local television and radio shows, including Fox TV, ABC TV, CBS TV, NBC TV, and he has served as a commentator on Court TV.

Allen and Barbara Rothenberg, Esq., are most proud of being parents to eight married children, including seven attorneys and a pediatric nurse practitioner/adjunct professor of nursing — and many, many grandchildren.

The Ben Hecht Award for Outstanding Journalism

is awarded annually by the Zionist Organization of America to a journalist, author or essayist whose work best exemplifies the principle that guided Ben Hecht: using one's communication talents in the service of Israel, Zionism, world Jewry and America.

Previous recipients of Greater Philadelphia ZOA's Ben Hecht Award include David Horowitz, Erick Stakelbeck, Nonie Darwish and Dom Giordano.

Ben Hecht (1894-1964) was a patriotic American who worked tirelessly to save European Jewry from the Nazis, and was a devoted Zionist. His pageants stirred Americans' souls and inspired people to act.

Early on Hecht was a journalist who covered World War I from Berlin for the *Chicago Daily News*.

A successful Hollywood writer, Hecht penned more than 70 credited and uncredited screenplays. He won two Academy Awards and was nominated for four others. He also wrote 35 books and wrote and produced Broadway plays. Among the screenplays he wrote or contributed to were: "Angels Over

Broadway," "Wuthering Heights," "Notorious," "Gone with the Wind," "Casino Royale," "Cleopatra," "Scarface," "The Sun Also Rises," "A Farewell to Arms," "Guys and Dolls," "Gunga Din," "Let Freedom Ring," "Angels with Dirty Faces," "Stagecoach" and "A Star Is Born."

Among his most important books were: *Perfidy*, *A Jew in Love* and *A Guide for the Bedevilled*. He co-wrote the play "The Front Page."

But it is not for Hecht's mastery of Hollywood that this prestigious award bears his name.

As Hitler and Nazi Germany threatened America's European allies and the dangers to European Jewry became known due to the work of Peter Bergson and the Bergson Group, Hecht called attention to the need to help our allies and to try to save Jews. He created articles, plays and pageants to alert and activate the masses.

When America entered World War II, Hecht immediately wrote the production "Uncle Sam Stands Up." In 1943, Hecht assembled top entertainment luminaries and wrote the pro-Jewish pageant, "We Will Never Die," performed at Madison Square Garden and staged in five other cities.

After the war, Hecht turned to helping re-establish the State of Israel. "He wrote the screenplay for the Bergson Group's production of "A Flag is Born," which opened September 5, 1946 in New York City. It raised nearly a half-million dollars for the American League For a Free Palestine (which supported the Irgun). "Hecht helped organize the Altalena's mission to bring weapons and immigrants to Israel," according to Marnie Winston-Macauley.

Ben Hecht Award Recipient Jonathan S. Tobin

Jonathan S. Tobin is the award-winning opinion editor of the Jewish News Service — JNS.org — and a contributing writer for *National Review*, the nation's pre-eminent conservative magazine of opinion and ideas. He is also a columnist for *the New York Post*, *The Federalist, Haaretz, Israel Hayom*, the *New York Jewish Week* and the *New Jersey Jewish News*. In his writing he covers on a daily basis the American political scene, foreign policy, the U.S.-Israel relationship, Middle East diplomacy and the Jewish world.

Previous to this, Tobin was executive editor and then senior online editor and chief political blogger for *Commentary* magazine for eight years. Prior to that he was editor-in-chief of the *Jewish Exponent* in Philadelphia for 10 years and before that editor of the *Connecticut Jewish Ledger*.

His writing also has appeared in the *Weekly Standard*, the *Christian Science Monitor*, the *American Spectator* and many other publications. Previously, he has also served as a columnist for Britain's *Jewish Chronicle* and was the author of the "View From America" column that appeared in *The Jerusalem Post*.

During his career Tobin has been honored 50 times for commentary, editorial writing and arts criticism. He has been named the top columnist and editorialist for Jewish newspapers several times as well as the top weekly columnist and editorial writer in Pennsylvania. In 2006, he received the distinction of being named the top editorial columnist and best arts critic in Greater Philadelphia by the Society of Professional Journalists.

He has lectured on campuses and to Jewish and other faith-based organizations around the country and appears on a regular basis on Newsmax TV. He has also appeared on CNN, Fox News Channel, Fox Business Channel, the BBC, Sky News, NPR, and Pacifica and on other media. He also tours the country debating Jewish and political issues with J.J. Goldberg of the *Forward*.

Mr. Tobin was born in New York City, attended local schools and studied history at Columbia University. He is also the proud father of Moriah Tobin, his 16-year-old daughter.

The ZOA Guardian of Israel Award

Israel has a strong, courageous and much-admired defense force. But the threats to Israel's existence are not limited to the battlefield.

Her enemies are constantly working to undermine and delegitimize Israel; to hurt her economically; to erase the overwhelming public support throughout much of the West for the Jewish State – including here in America. Other adversaries work within the Jewish community to weaken affinity with the Jewish state.

These enemies trade in lies and propaganda. Their weapons include doctored photos; quotes and statistics taken out of context; phony "victims" and staged events for the media; and promises of peace they have no intention of fulfilling.

They are particularly effective against our young, impressionable and under-informed members of the community.

There are also the timeless foes known as "complacency" and "apathy."

It is our duty, as people who love Israel, to take on these enemies and counter them with education and advocacy and activism.

By writing and talking, demonstrating and lobbying, buying goods from Israel, hearing from guest speakers from Israel and other acts, we fight back and protect Israel in the war of ideas.

Some go the extra mile, casting aside "political correctness," rolling up their sleeves, cajoling and nudging and assertively imparting their love for Israel to others. They speak with family and friends, or young people, or congregants, or colleagues about these matters. They work tirelessly in the foreground and in the background.

They know just the right thing to say to light that spark in an individual or a congregation. Some even take people to Israel to give them a first-hand experience.

They instill pride in Israel and make sure we never forget our Israeli brothers and sisters nor our homeland.

Such people are worthy of the title "Guardian of Israel."

ZOA Guardian of Israel Award Recipient Rabbi Yaacov Orimland

Rabbi Yaacov Orimland is religious leader of Young Israel of Margate, where he has been the pulpit rabbi since 2014. His career has been devoted to education and outreach.

A native of Brazil, he grew up in Miami and also lived in Israel for 15 years. While there he ran *Nishmat Shlomo*, a yeshiva for American kids who abused drugs — encouraging them to join the IDF once they were clean. He still owns a home in Tzfat and visits Israel at least twice a year.

After the Holocaust, his parents moved to Israel. His grandfather had lived in Tel Aviv. His father went to yeshiva in Israel and in the 1950s was a police officer.

Rabbi Orimland believes "Israel was given to us before 1948. It was a gift from G-d. It doesn't matter what UNESCO says." Decisions by UNESCO and similar bodies' pronouncements, he says are "not [merely] anti-Israel or anti-Zionist. It's anti-Jewish."

Rabbi Orimland received his *Smicha* in Israel. He also attended the Talmudic University of Miami. He received a number of community service awards while in Florida.

His outreach philosophy is similarly straight-forward: "It doesn't matter how you dress, or how you look: Because a Jew is a Jew is a Jew — Period. We cannot take anything for granted. Ten times a day we have to thank G-d for what we have: our health, our families." He adds: "Everyone is welcome to our synagogue."

The Young Israel movement began in 1912 "The aims and purposes of the organization shall be to foster and maintain a program of spiritual, cultural, social and communal activity towards the advancement and perpetuation of traditional Torah-true Judaism; and to instill into American Jewish youth an understanding and appreciation of the high ethical and spiritual values of Judaism and demonstrate the compatibility of the ancient faith of Israel with good Americanism." (From the Preamble of the National Council of Young Israel Constitution).

Rabbi Orimland is married, and he and his wife have eight children and 29 grandchildren.

The ZOA Friends of Zion Award

ZOA Friends of Zion Award Recipients Jim and Diane Showers

Dr. Jim Showers is the executive director of The Friends of Israel, a worldwide Christian organization founded in Philadelphia in 1938 by Christians determined to help Europe's beleaguered Jewish population. Today it is headquartered in Deptford, NJ.

Jim joined The Friends of Israel (FOI) in 2002 as director of finance, treasurer, and chief financial officer. He then served as executive vice president and became president and executive director in May 2012.

During Jim's tenure at FOI, he has been a tremendous help to the ministry, demonstrating capable ministry-wide leadership and management skills. He also serves as a member of FOI's board of trustees.

Jim's personal warmth, knowledge, and wisdom, as well as his devotion to the Lord and sincere love for Israel and the Jewish people, are qualities everyone at FOI has valued. In 2012, he developed the Hesed "Loving Kindness" Project, FOI's adult-volunteer program in Israel.

Jim speaks at conferences, churches, and schools nationwide; is a frequent participant in events supporting Israel; and is a strong advocate of the country's growing Jewish-Christian alliance. He also has helped lead two joint Jewish-Christian trips to Israel and is the leader of the semiannual Friends of Israel Up to Jerusalem tours.

Jim authors "Inside View," a regular column featured in FOI's magazine *Israel My Glory*, with a readership of over half a million in 151 countries. His popular series "The Black Sheep of Christendom" exposing the dangers of "replacement theology" was originally published in *Israel My Glory*.

Jim earned both his master of divinity and doctor of ministry degrees from Baptist Bible Seminary. His doctoral thesis was titled, "May They Prosper Who Love You: A Case For Christian Zionism."

Diane Showers supports Jim to build solidarity with the Jewish community. She was born and raised in Goshen, IN. From the time she became an active Christian at a young age, she has known and expressed a love for the land of Israel and the Jewish people. As an office professional, Diane has served in churches and evangelical Christian organizations.

Motivated by the special place Israel and the Jewish people have in her heart, she has followed the Lord's command in Genesis to bless the descendants of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob. In 2003 and 2007, Diane was a part of the joint Jewish and Christian trips to Israel. She has helped Jim lead several tours to Israel and attends many events with him. As a committed Christian Zionist, Diane is actively involved in numerous efforts in support of Israel. Jim and Diane live in southern New Jersey and have two married children and four grandchildren.

Master of Ceremonies Gary Erlbaum

We are blessed to have Gary Erlbaum in our community and grateful that once again he is our master-of-ceremonies this evening.

Businessman, philanthropist, raconteur and good soul, he is the patriarch of a family who has touched the lives of so many people in a positive way.

The president of Greentree Properties Corporation, a real estate investment and development firm, Erlbaum has been an officer and director of multiple companies, both public and private.

Erlbaum has just completed a three year stint as vice president of the Jewish Federation of Greater Philadelphia and also is a past chairman of Federation's Israel Advocacy Task Force, founding co-chair of Federation's Israel & Overseas Center and a member of its board of directors and board of trustees. He is a past member of the board of governors of the Jewish Agency in Jerusalem as well as its Task Force on Anti-Semitism. Over the years he has been intimately involved with the Federation Allied Jewish Appeal campaign and has served as an associate chairman of major gifts. He has served as chairman of the Israel Emergency Campaigns.

Erlbaum has served both as president and chairman of the Jewish Publishing Group, which publishes the *Jewish Exponent* and *Inside* magazine.

He is also past chairman of the Philadelphia State of Israel Bonds and served with distinction as the North American Chairman of Israel Bonds Young Leadership.

Erlbaum serves on the boards of the Zionist Organization of America, the Damon Runyon Cancer Research Foundation, Boys Town Jerusalem, the Chevra, Etz Chaim and the Holocaust Awareness Museum. He is a member of the advisory board of Jerusalem Online University. He has served on the boards of the Jewish Community Centers of Greater Philadelphia, the Solomon Schechter Day School (now Perelman Jewish Day School) and the Shipley School.

Morton A. Klein is National President of the Zionist Organization of America (ZOA), the oldest pro-Israel group in the U.S., founded in 1897. He is widely regarded as one of the leading Jewish activists in America.

A child of Holocaust survivors, Klein was born in a displaced persons camp in Gunzberg, Germany. He was an economist who served in the Nixon, Ford, and Carter administrations. He has served as a biostatistician at the UCLA School of Public Health and the Linus Pauling Institute of Science and Medicine in Palo Alto, Calif., having worked closely with two-time Nobel Laureate Linus Pauling. He has been a lecturer in mathematics and statistics at Temple University.

Klein is a member of the National Council of AIPAC and a member of the International Board of Governors of Ariel University in Ariel, Israel.

Under Klein's leadership, *The Jerusalem Post* has called the ZOA "one of the most important and influential groups in the U.S. today." *The Wall Street Journal* called the ZOA "heroic and the most credible advocate for Israel on the American Jewish scene today" and added, we should "snap a salute to those who were right about Oslo and Arafat all along, including Morton Klein who was wise, brave, and unflinchingly honest."

Klein's successful campaigns against anti-Israel bias in leading textbooks, travel guides, universities, churches, and the media, as well as his work on Capitol Hill were the subject of 30 feature stories both here and in Israel, including in *The New York Times* and *Los Angeles Times*.

His scientific research on nutrition and heart disease was cited by *Discover* magazine as one of the Top 50 Scientific Studies of 1992. While a health economist in Washington, Klein was also the first to determine and publicize the dangers of annual mammograms for women under the age of 50, changing national policy in this area, including the reduction of radiation emission from mammograms.

Klein has appeared numerous times on TV and radio, including on NBC National News, Jim Lehrer News Hour, O'Reilly Factor, CNN, Fox-TV, The Kelly File with Megyn Kelly, Erin Burnett OutFront, CNBC, MSNBC, NPR, BBC, C-Span, VOA and Israel TV and radio.

He has delivered more than 400 lectures throughout the world including at Harvard, Yale, Princeton, Stanford, UC/Berkeley, MIT, Columbia, Penn, Michigan, Brandeis, Brigham Young, and at Israel's Hebrew University, Ben-Gurion University and Ariel University. He has also spoken at the National Academy of Sciences, Institute of Medicine, General Assembly (Federation) meetings, Israel Bonds, B'nai B'rith Canada, Rabbinic Council of America, JCRC's and synagogues from coast to coast, and the U.S. Department of State's Distinguished Lecture Series.

"Nikolai Berdayev (*The Meaning of History*, 1936) came to the conclusion that the script of Jewish history bears the mark of God's hand.

Berdayev: 'The survival [of Jews] is a mysterious and wonderful phenomenon demonstrating that the life of this people is governed by a special predetermination, transcending the processes of adaptation expounded by the materialistic interpretation of history. The survival of the Jews, their resistance to destruction, their endurance under absolutely peculiar conditions and the fateful role played by them in history: all these point to the particular and mysterious foundations of their destiny.'

Again, this perspective imposes enormous responsibility on Jews throughout the generations and on Israelis of this era – to live up to those "particular and mysterious foundations" and to the ethical exhortations articulated by our sources.

Israel must celebrate more than its material achievements – whether they are in military, medicine, hi-tech, agriculture, energy, or the arts. It must not accept "average" levels of crime or domestic violence. The state and people of Israel must be socially and morally super-conscientious; and in so doing, point beyond themselves to something grander than the natural order."
