Anti-Israel Hatred is Not Funny.

Despite the numerous and far-reaching concessions that the Israeli government of Ehud Barak has made to Yasir Arafat and the Palestinian Authority, anti-Israel hate cartoons are appearing regularly in Arafat's official newspaper, *Al-Hayat Al-Jadidah*.

Barak has surrendered more territory than required by the Oslo accords, freed imprisoned Arab terrorists, and made additional concessions. Yet Arafat's newspaper is filled with the same kind of venom that appeared regularly under previous Israeli governments. Barak is depicted as a warmonger, a liar, and an oppressor of Arabs. Other cartoons in *Al-HayatAl-Jadidah* portray Israeli soldiers in Nazi military helmets; depict Jews with huge noses and other hateful stereotypical features; compare Israeli policies to the "ethnic cleansing" savagery in Kosovo; mock the suffering of the Jewish hostages in Iran; and harshly attack the United States.

In the pages that follow, you will find a sampling of these shocking cartoons. They are not merely expressions of offensive opinions. They incite hatred against Israel that can lead to violence. These anti-Israel hate cartoons have helped create the atmosphere that has encouraged the Palestinian Arab terrorist murders of nearly 300 Israelis since the Oslo accords were signed in 1993.

The Oslo accords signed by Israel and the Palestinian Arabs specifically require the Palestinian Authority to "abstain from incitement, including hostile propaganda." (Oslo II, Article XXII [1] But it is more than just a provision in a treaty. Arafat was supposed to end hostile propaganda in order to begin to transform the hearts and minds of the Palestinian Arabs, so that they would stop hating and murdering Jews. Instead, Arafat is sending Palestinian Arabs the same message of bigotry that he was sending them before the Oslo accords were signed.

As the noted historian Paul Johnson has written (in his book *A History of the Jews*): "One of the principal lessons of Jewish history has been that repeated slanders are sooner or later followed by violent physical deeds."



About the Zionist Organization of America






Al-Hayat Al-Jadidah - December 30, 1999



The cloud is labeled "Israeli Promises." The Jew, with the big nose and traditional side-locks, is saying "It's a summer cloud, habibi" (i.e. Nothing will come of it).

This cartoon appeared immediately after the attempter Arab suicide bombings in Haifa and Tiberias, when Israel initially refrained from revealing the names of the terrorists while it was searching for their accomplices. In this cartoon, the Arab is saying "And what about ...?" And reading a newspaper that says "Not Revealing Names of the Three Suicides."










